MAYOR CUTS RIBBON FOR NEW TECHNOLOGY CENTER

CHARLESTON, SC. (Oct. 24, 2007) - Mayor Joseph P. Riley, Jr., Charleston, SC, cut the ribbon during the opening ceremony to officially open eLifespaces' new design showroom and technology center in the Charleston's "neck" area at 12:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 24th.

Among those on hand for the event, in addition to officials of the Lifespaces Corporation and members of its board of directors, were Charleston Mayor Joseph P Riley, Jr. and several other community and city leaders.

The event took place at 1799 Meeting Street Road where eLifespaces constructed a two-story, 7,800-square-foot facility. The

building houses the company's sales and operations employees who are relocating from their leased facility in Mount Pleasant.



Fred Fabian, eLifespaces' President, said, "Relocating from its leased facility on Long Point Road and building this new facility represents a long-term commitment to the Charleston Gateway area and to the City of Charleston."

The new technology center houses a state of the art, six-seat home theater as well as audio and video calibration rooms displaying varying levels of acoustic isolation and interior room treatments. "Our new facility is more than a just a showroom. It's a place where our customers can come to see and play with the latest high end audio and video components," Fabian said.

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What was the name of RCA's Mascot?

This stray dog was adopted in 1884 by the Barraud family. The dog was often seen curiously looking into a gramophone to locate the origin of the sound. In 1899 Francis Barraud painted this image, an image which ultimately ended up at the Victor Talking Machine Company as its logo. Later acquired by RCA, the dog was soon adopted as their mascot. In 1991, the dog was joined by a similar looking puppy.

LADDER SAFETY INSPECTION

A ladder safety program began this year's monthly safety program. One of the handiest tools, portable ladders are not complicated; yet, planning and care are still required to use them safely. Each year in the U.S., accidents involving ladders cause an estimated 300 deaths and 130,000 injuries requiring emergency medical attention. Ladder accidents usually are caused by improper selection, care or use, not by

manufacturing defects. Selective tips for safe use:

- Do not stand on the ladder's top three rungs
- The base should be spaced 1 foot away for every 4 feet it reaches up
- Do not try reaching so far that you lose your balance; move the ladder.
- Step ladders should be securely spread open. Never use a folding step ladder in an unfolded position.

- Designed as "one-person" equipment, select the appropriate rated ladder for the task at hand.
